MESSAGE "I Am" Rev. Shawn Garvey

John's gospel is rich with many "I am" statements from Jesus, describing who and what he is. This morning, we hear him describe himself as the good shepherd. The word "good" here can also mean "true," and the reference to the good shepherd refers to Ezekiel 34, where God as the good or true shepherd of God's people cares for the sheep, rescuing them from where they have been scattered, feeding them, and tending to the weak, injured, and lost. To this, Jesus adds that the good shepherd also lays down his life for the sheep. In hearing Jesus describe himself this way, how then do we reflect on our own roles as shepherds in the living of our own lives for the people around us?

Omer Westendorf, 1964




